Established in 1952, Redwood Parents Nursery School (RPNS) is a non-profit, parent-education, cooperative preschool in Redwood City. At RPNS, children have an opportunity to learn through play with a broad selection of hands-on experiences and materials. The children participate in large group, small group, and free play activities with an emphasis on free play. We strive to provide a place where children develop their self-esteem as they participate in an environment that encourages and respects their independence and capabilities in physical, social, and emotional development. We believe this is the foundation for personal success and academic achievement in years to come.

# Parent Education Classes

Our monthly night classes are an opportunity to learn about parenting styles, early childhood development and build community. All of the RPNS teachers hold California state teaching credentials in Parent Education and it is during the night classes that the parents are given the opportunity to increase their knowledge and share their observations of the children. Night classes are held in person at school.

# We offer classes for...

Wednesday OR Friday Toddlers 9:00-11:00 am (age 13 months by Sept. 1) \$205.00/mo

Instructor: Teacher Andi

Parent Participation: Parent remains with child during class, taking different areas of responsibility in turn, such as snack, art, housekeeping or outside yard. Attends a two-hour parent education class each month in the evening. 2 absences are permitted each school year. Attends at least 2 evening community building events per year. Each family is required to participate on a school committee, volunteer 2 hours toward the Halloween Carnival and contribute 2 hours of maintenance per year.

Twos (or mixed ages 2's & 3's if space allows\*) Tuesdays & Thursdays 9:00-11:30 am (age 2 by Sept. 1) \$320.00/mo

Instructor: Teacher Andi

Parent Participation: Parent works in the classroom one day per week (possibly two days for twins), taking a different area of responsibility in turn, such as kitchen, art, main room or upper yard. Attends a two-hour parent education class each month in the evening. 2 absences are permitted each school year. Attends at least 3 evening community building events per school year. Each family is required to participate on a school committee, volunteer 2 hours toward the Halloween Carnival and contribute 4 hours of maintenance per year.

Mixed Ages 3's & 4's Monday, Wednesday, and Friday; 8:30-11:30 am (age 3 by Sept. 1) \$545.00/mo

Instructors: Teacher Kathy & Teacher Carina

Parent Participation: Parent works in the classroom one day per week (possibly two days for twins), taking a different area of responsibility in turn, such as kitchen, art, main room or upper yard. Attends a two-hour parent education class each month in the evening. 2 absences are permitted each school year. Attends at least 3 evening community building events per school year. Each family is required to participate on a school committee, volunteer 2 hours toward the Halloween Carnival and contribute 4 hours of maintenance per year.

Pre-K Enrichment\* Tuesdays and Thursdays 12:30-3:30 pm (must be 3yrs 9mo by September 1)360.00/mo

Centered around a play-based curriculum, this class creates a dynamic learning environment where children can explore and discover through hands-on activities. We aim to nurture creativity, social skills, and early cognitive development in a fun and supportive setting. This class is designed to help children develop the necessary skills to prepare them for kindergarten. Our dedicated teacher will guide these playful adventures, ensuring a rich and engaging pre-K experience for each child.

Instructor: Teacher Carina

Parent participation: Work one day a week in the classroom (possibly less, pending enrollment numbers). Attend a two hour parent education class each month in the evening (2 absences per year). Attend at least 3 community building events per school year. Each family is required participate on a school committee, volunteer 2 hours towards Halloween Carnival and contribute 4 hours of maintenance per year.

**Exploration Through Play\*** (age 4 by Sept 1) Monday and Wednesday, 2-4pm \$200/mo for 1 day per week; \$400/mo for 2 days/week

Class Description: This after-school program for TK/K age children fosters creativity and social development through interactive and age-appropriate activities. Designed to engage young minds, the program provides a supportive environment where kids can explore, learn, and build essential skills through imaginative play.

Instructor: Teacher Carina

Parent Participation: No workday or night class requirements. We do ask parents to participate on a school committee, volunteer 2 hours to the Halloween Carnival and contribute 4 hours of maintenance per year.

### **Membership Requirements**

Co-op parents are dedicated people who work together for a common goal, the goal of providing the best education possible for the children and parents in our community. As a member, fulfilling your obligations is key to the operation and success of RPNS. Following are the participation requirements for each family...

#### **Class Work Day**

A member of each family works in the classroom one day per week. The working parent takes a different area of responsibility each week, such as kitchen, art, main room, bikes or upper yard.

#### **Night Education Classes**

Attendance at monthly night classes is required. The classes provide an opportunity to learn about parenting styles and early childhood development. Sessions are in the evening and are 2 hours for the Toddlers families and 2.5 hours for the Twos, Threes and Pre-K families. Families are permitted two absences per year.

#### **Community Building Events**

There will be 5-7 Community Building Events scheduled for the year. Families in the Toddler class are required to attend at least 2 events and families in the Twos, Threes and Pre-K classes are required to attend at least 3 events. These events will include: Dad's Night/Box City (except for Toddlers), T-Shirt Making Night, SMCPPNS Parent Resource Night, Janet Cocconi Memorial Dinner and Auction, and Bookmaking Night

#### **Maintenance**

Every family at RPNS participates in one school maintenance day on a pre-planned Saturday. Toddler families are required to do one 2-hour maintenance session per school year. Twos, Threes and Pre-K families are required to do one 4-hour maintenance session per school year.

#### **Committee Participation**

Each family will be placed on a committee based on family preference. The committees are either event-specific or on-going for the year and include Halloween Carnival, Annual Dinner/Auction, Graduation Event, Purchasing, Laundry, Membership and Maintenance. If you prefer to be involved in a leadership position at the school, you might consider participating on the school Board. Board members do not hold additional committee responsibilities.

#### **Fundraising**

Your fundraising commitment is 2 hours devoted to the Halloween Carnival. You may either assist setting up/cleaning up the event or work one of the booths during the carnival. Participation in other fundraising events during the school year is encouraged, but not required.

Open Enrollment will be online, RPNS.org on Saturday, February 10, 2024 at 9:30am. A \$75 non-refundable registration fee is due at that time. Prior to enrolling we ask you do the following:

- Attend one of the information sessions at our Open House on Saturday, February 3rd from 9:30am - 12pm. Please bring your children for activities and games and to meet our teachers, board members and families. Info sessions covering the details of programs are at 10am and 11:15am (you do not need to attend both)
